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I Thou

I-Thou, theological doctrine of the full, direct, mutual relation between beings, as conceived by Martin Buber and some other 20th-century philosophers. The basic and purest form of this relation is that between man and God (the Eternal Thou), which is the model for and makes possible I-Thou relations between human beings.

The I-Thou relationship cannot be explained; it simply is. Nothing can intervene in the I-Thou relationship. I-Thou is not a means to some object or goal, but a definitive relationship involving the whole being of each subject. Like the I-Thou relation, love is a subject-to-subject relationship.

The notion of I-Thou was developed by the twentieth-century, Jewish philosopher Martin Buber (February 8, 1878 - June 13, 1965). It appeared in his famous work of the same name I and Thou. In a healthy man there is a dialectical interaction between the two situations : every I-it contains the potential of becoming I-Thou, the situation in which man's true personality emerges within the context of his world.

I, Thou, and It - a three-way relationship in which “I and Thou” are the people (often a teacher and child, though not always) and “It” is the content that compels both. This three part relationship supports both the development of understanding of the content and the development of human relationships.

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I-Thou is a relationship of mutuality and reciprocity, while I-It is a relationship of separateness and detachment. Buber explains that human beings may try to convert the subject-to-subject relation to a subject-to-object relation, or vice versa.

Martin Buber's I and Thou

The I-Thou relationship where one meets the other as who they are rather than what they represent is powerful and healing. Rather than looking at a mother who is living at a shelter as a “homeless mother,” we can see her as a mother and a woman with a name and a personal story to share.

Comparing Martin Buber's 'I-Thou' to 'I-It'

Thou addresses another not as an object but as a presence — the highest in philosopher Amelie Rorty's seven layers of personhood, which she defines as “the return of the unchartable soul.” Buber writes: If I face a human being as my Thou, and say
